A. Importance

- Managing your bibliographic data (book list, research notes, online resources in various formats):
As pastor-scholars, we need more in-depth digestions and reflections instead of brief and shallow messages on social media!
Consequences we now face in a post-truth world where there is a constant flood of information:
 - fake news, distorted news, opinions, and views accepted as presented superficially
 - not only news but now every aspect in our daily life in this global village: social life, church life, personal faith, and theological studies
 - depth vs. breadth. You are what you read!
 - We need a space to reorganize, to reprioritize and to reflect
- Formatting issues: footnotes and bibliography in accordance to recognised citation styles
- Avoiding plagiarism

B. Characteristics

- Standalone program + web browser plugin
- Stable
- Synchronization: online and offline
- Different ways to organize your stuff: library dir (main categories, e.g. by disciplines), notes (reviews/comments), tags (categories in another perspectives, e.g. interesting/boring/essentials), etc
- Platforms: PC, Mac (Mobile: 3rd party apps, see [here](#))

C. Basic Use

- Program & plugin: <https://www.zotero.org/download/>
- Plugin for Word: https://www.zotero.org/support/word_processor_integration
- Register and sync your account
 - user account size limit: 300Mb
 - never store your pdf files there and you will never use up the quota. I started using it since 2009 and now I only used 27Mb
- Building up your library comprehensively from: Google Books, Amazon, EBSCO/ALTAS journal websites thru bit.ly/ESLibCat, Academic websites like OUP, Academia, WorldCat.org, <http://www.ottobib.com/>
- Loading it in Word

D. Chinese Citation Style

- Various Chinese styles throughout the years, by various Chinese seminaries (years ago our Alfred Suen wrote one for ES).
 - Problems: incomplete, inconsistency, esp. with Turabian/Chicago style mostly used in the western world. Example: 楊牧谷: 〈Ignorance 無知〉, 楊牧谷主編: 《當代神學辭典》上冊 (台北: 校園, 1997)。
- Style guide we now use: 李志秋和張心瑋, 《學術研究與寫作: 聖經、神學與教牧學研究手冊》, 第三版 (新加坡: 新加坡神學院, 2019)
 - Currently the most complete one in Chinese theological circles

- 安裝：從學院內部的 Google drive folder “學術研究與寫作_Zotero 版” (校友要取連結請聯繫我)，下載 chinese-research-writing-20200819.csl，在 Zoom Preferences / Cite 中按 “+”，把這檔案加進去，會出現“不是個有效 CSL 1.0.1 樣式檔，而且無法與 Zotero 搭配”信息，但照按確定便可。
- Zotero 輸入中文項目時留意：

- The authors plan to publish it online towards Nov/Dec after revising the guides

E. Building up a Library Database as a Scholar-Pastor

1. Andy Naselli (Associate Professor of New Testament and Theology at Bethlehem College & Seminary):
 - a. My Personal Library.
 - b. Exegesis and Biblical Theology
 - Hermeneutics
 - New Testament. This breaks down into Gospels, Greek, Individual NT Books, Johannine Studies, Letters, NT History, NT Introduction and Survey, NT People, NT Textual Criticism, NT Theology, and Pauline Studies. For the individual NT and OT books, the main collections include resources on the entire biblical book (e.g., commentaries), and subfolders include special studies (e.g., books and articles on only a portion of a biblical book).
 - Old Testament. This breaks down into Hebrew, Individual OT Books, Jesus in the OT, OT History, OT Introduction and Survey, OT People, OT Textual Criticism, OT Theology, Pentateuch, Poetry, Prophecy, and Wisdom Literature.
 - Primary Sources. Bibles in English, Greek, Hebrew, Latin, and modern languages.
 - Second Temple Judaism
 - Whole Bible. This includes General Reference, Geography, Survey of Resources (e.g., commentary survey), Whole-Bible Biblical Theology (e.g., Kingdom of God, OT in the NT, Salvation History, Typology), Whole-Bible Commentary, and Whole-Bible Introduction and Survey.
 - c. Historical Theology
 - Introduction and Survey
 - Groups and Ideologies
 - Historiography
 - Individuals
 - Periods of History
 - d. Other. This is for mostly my non-theological resources.
 - e. Practical Theology
 - Christian Liberty and Lifestyle Choices
 - Christian Living: General (e.g., devotionals)
 - Counselling and Psychology
 - Culture
 - Education and Scholarship...
 - f. Systematic Theology
 - Apologetics. Subcategories include Approaches (esp. presuppositionalism), Atheism and Agnosticism, Cults, Miracles, Problem of Evil and Suffering, Reliability of the Bible, and World Religions.
 - Bible Doctrine. This includes the basic categories in a typical systematic theology and subcategories for each.

Who Is God?: Key Moments of Biblical Revelation
 Author: Bauckham, Richard
 Abstract: Internationally respected scholar Richard Bauckham offers a brief, engaging study of divine revelation in Scripture. He probes the deep meaning of well-known moments in the biblical story in order to address the key question the Bible is designed to answer: Who is God? Accessible for laypeople and important to scholars, this volume begins by exploring three key events in the Bible in which God is revealed: Jacob's dream at Bethel (the revelation of the divine presence), Moses at the burning bush (the revelation of the divine Name), and Moses on Mount Sinai (the revelation of the divine character). In each case, Bauckham traces these themes through the rest of Scripture. He then shows how the New Testament builds on the Old by exploring three revelatory events in Mark's Gospel, events that reveal the Trinity: Jesus's baptism, transfiguration, and crucifixion. This book is based on the Frumentius Lectures for 2015 at the Ethiopian Graduate School of Theology in Addis Ababa and on the Haywood Lectures for 2018 at Acadia Divinity College, Nova Scotia.
